REVIEW OF PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENTS FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT

We are pleased to report a successful year for the Friends. We remitted £40,000 to Seva Mandir following a very successful fundraising event in November and a significant grant from the Erach and Roshan Sadri Foundation.

The year was also marked by the beginning of a transition from the Officers who have served so ably for the last fifteen years to a new team who will take up the leadership of the UK Friends in Spring 2012. In order to assist a smooth transition and prepare the foundations for the future good workings of the Friends, a new constitution has been approved by the Charity Commission. Essentially, the new constitution allows a greater number of officers, and clearly defines their roles and tenure.

Doing what we do

The fundamental role of Friends of Seva Mandir is to support the work of Seva Mandir and their extraordinary efforts to relieve poverty, sickness and distress, as well as enhance the education of individuals within villages in the Indian State of Rajasthan.

Last November, we were delighted to host Lady Pamela Hicks and the writer and journalist Shrabani Basu who eloquently spoke about Shrabani's book, *Victoria and Abdul: The True Story of the Queen's Closest Confidante*. The event at the Linnean Society at Burlington House attracted a full house. After the presentations, a most convivial reception took place where guests were able to acquire books by Shrabani and Lady Pamela Hicks.

During the year, the Friends appointed a fundraising administrative assistant, Marie-Louise Gourlay, to refresh our approach to obtaining grants as well as building a new website, an increasingly important means of communicating the good work of Seva Mandir. We are particularly grateful to the small number of donors for funding the costs of the administrative assistant. These fundraising initiatives were instrumental in our being able to remit £40,000 to Seva Mandir, the largest transfer for some years.

Recognition for Seva Mandir

The last year has seen the publication of three new books, each of which talks splendidly about the work of Seva Mandir. Fizzy Ardalan's magnificent *Silver Fodder* describes leaders in the villages where Seva Mandir works. Fizzy volunteered in Rajasthan and could not be better placed to describe his unique personal experiences.

Sir Mark Tully published *Non-stop India*, and one chapter, 'Building Communities', pays tribute to Seva Mandir's commitment to strengthen village people's ability. We hope to see Sir Mark in 2012.

Finally, MIT Professors Abhijit Banerjee and Esther Duflo have written the extraordinary *Poor Economics*. This book, winner of the FT Goldman Sachs Business Book of the Year, makes repeated reference to the work of Seva Mandir. The authors say "Seva Mandir's immunisation program is one of the most impressive we have ever evaluated, and probably the one that has saved the most lives".

These independent endorsements of Seva Mandir's work could not better demonstrate the importance of the charity itself and the role that the Friends of Seva Mandir in the UK can play.

STRUCTURE AND OBJECTIVES

We are delighted to announce the appointment of the new Vice-Patrons Baroness Williams, Baroness Flather, Lady Wade-Gery, Ravi Govindia and Praveen Moman. They are joined by Giulia Ajmone Marsan in recognition of her sterling work as Adminsitrator for so many years. The presence of the Vice-Patrons and, of course, our Patron, the Countess Mountbatten of Burma, is important and vital to the future success of the Friends. We cannot overstate our thanks for their support and wise guidance to the Friends.

Following consideration of the number of officers required and the skills, knowledge and experience of our future needs, we are pleased to welcome the new Officer team: Chris Wiscarson, Robert Westlake, John MacAuslan, Mark Francis, Kully Dada, Araddhya Mehta and Jonathan Berman. We are also pleased to welcome new Administrator Mandy Pirrie whose support will be very much valued.

The Friends of Seva Mandir OFFICERS' REPORT

Before going to print in April 2012, we were delighted to host Seva Mandir's Chairman, Ajay Mehta, and Chief Executive, Priyanka Singh, in London. Their presence and unique perspective bring the work of Seva Mandir to life in a profound way.

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES AND AFFAIRS

In the financial year ending 31 March 2012 the Friends raised £53,093. The grant paid to Seva Mandir was £40,000.

The Fundraising event raised £28,620 gross, excluding Gift Aid. The Friends, thanks to the work of the Fundraising and Administrative Assistant, increased the support from charitable trusts during this year to £8,000. Furthermore, donations and gifts from supporters brought £5,516, excluding Gift Aid. Gift Aid and interest receivable yielded an additional £4,443. Furthermore, £6,500 were specifically raised from a small number of donors to support the cost of the Fundraising and Administrative Assistant.

Fundraising costs were £15,450 of which £8,802 represents the cost of the Fundraising and Administrative Assistant and £3,436 the cost of organising and running the event. Total administrative expenditure amounted to £671. Baker Tilly, Chartered Accountants, generously waived their fees. The Administrator, Giulia Ajmone Marsan, is a volunteer who is only reimbursed actual expenses incurred on behalf of the charity as authorised by the Treasurer. Thanks also go to Volcanoes Safaris for their continuing pro bono support.

The risk policy will be reviewed as required in 2012-2013.

The level of the reserves will be reviewed as required in 2012-2013.

FUTURE PLANS FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT

For the next three year period, the new Officers will review and develop a fund raising strategy and policies as required.

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

In preparing the financial statements the Charity follows best practice in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (Revised 2005), the charity's governing document, and the Charities Act 2011.

DONATIONS, LEGACIES AND SIMILAR INCOMING RESOURCES

Donations and other income are credited in the year in which they are receivable.

Unless incapable of financial measurement, legacies are credited as income in the year in which they are receivable. A legacy is classed as receivable once probate has been granted in respect of the legatee's estate.

GRANTS RECEIVABLE

Grants are credited in the year in which they are receivable.

INVESTMENT INCOME

Investment income is accounted for in the year in which the charity is entitled to receipt.

RESOURCES EXPENDED

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Irrecoverable VAT is charged against the category of resources expended from which it was incurred.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the Statement of Financial Activities on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly whilst others are apportioned on an appropriate basis.

COST OF GENERATING FUNDS

Cost of generating funds comprises those costs directly attributable to the Charity's fund raising activities.

GRANTS PAYABLE

Grants payable are charged in the year when the offer is conveyed.

ALLOCATION OF SUPPORT COSTS

The cost of support functions are allocated to the Charity's sole activity.

CASH FLOW STATEMENT

The Charity has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 1 (Revised) on the basis that it qualifies as a small entity.
